
ABOUT

According to the World Economic Forum the "The Fourth Industrial Revolution (4IR) represents a fundamental change in the way we live, work and relate to one another. It is a new chapter in human development, the underlying advances bear huge promises, but also perils. The speed, breadth and depth of this revolution has created disruption of existing business models, new enterprises and a vivid start up scene. The way we make payments, bank and invest will change in this new era where the business model is dictated by technology."

We pretend to tackle some of the ethical problems of the 4IR and to get an overview of its ethical challenges of AI, encryption and startup finance. This applies in particular for females in these industries, from women lawyers, judges, attorneys-at-law, investors, bankers, portfolio managers, solicitors or civil servants. All industries are affected by industry 4.0. in particular science, finance, regtech, or startup industries. The 4IR is more than technology-driven change; it is a call to leaders, policy-makers and business leaders to harness converging technologies in order to create an inclusive, humancentred future. 
